Another week has gone by in a whirlwind. The children have focused on two celebrations this week; Diwali and Remembrance day. For Diwali 'The Festival of Light' we learnt about how it is celebrated and shared the story Dipal's Diwali. The children danced with colourful scarfs to Indian music, we made Rangoli patterns using paint, chalks and pastels. The children looked at mehndi patterns and designed their own on a hand template.

For Remembrance day, every child made a poppy and planted it at the front of school. We used the bottom of a plastic bottle and a garden stick, but they look very effective. We talked about the soldiers and why Remembrance day is important to many. We even managed the 2 minutes' silence which is tricky when you're 3 and 4 and very intrigued with everything going on around you. The children painted poppies and we have hung them in the classroom.

In maths we have learnt about number 7. The children have been counting items, practicing forming the number 7 and looking for it in the environment.

We have continued learning about Autumn and the children have been printing with leaves and paint this week. We have talked about Autumn and the changes we can see in the environment.

Next week is anti-bullying week, in EYFS we will be learning about how we can be a good friend and why it important to be kind to others. Then on Friday we will be raising money for BBC Children in Need, information is on Belthorn weekly newsletter. Children can come to school in spotty clothes or bright colourful clothes.
